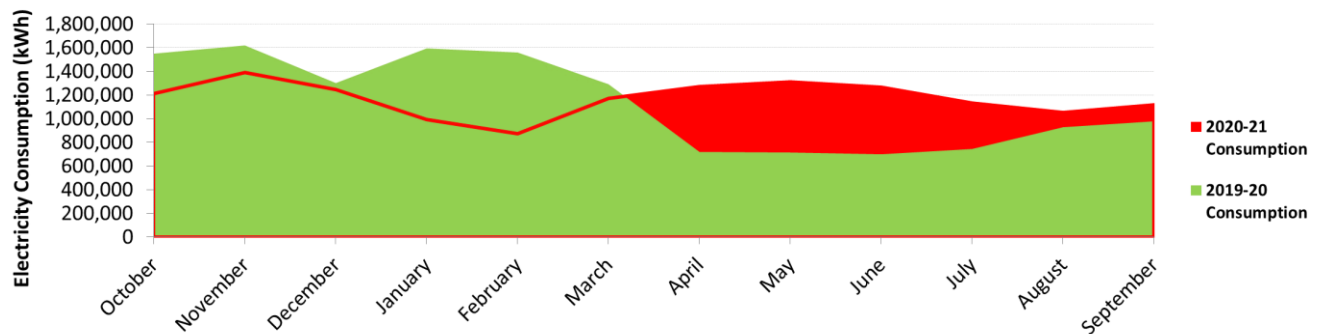

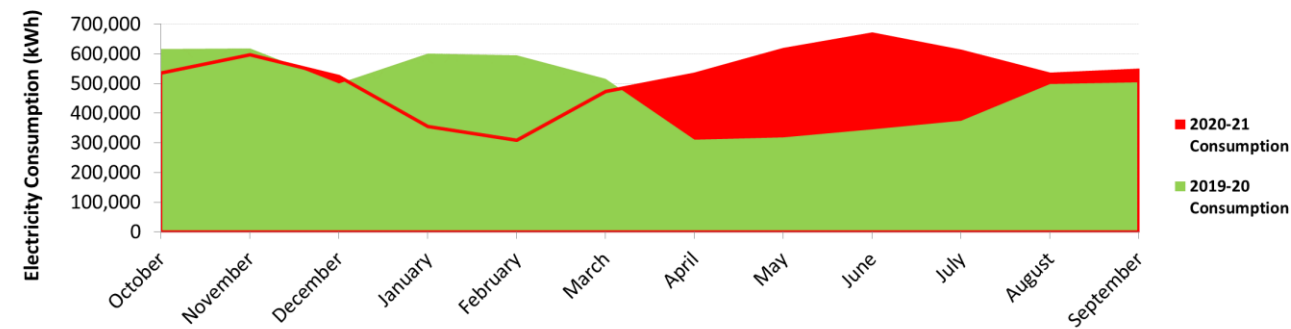


UAL

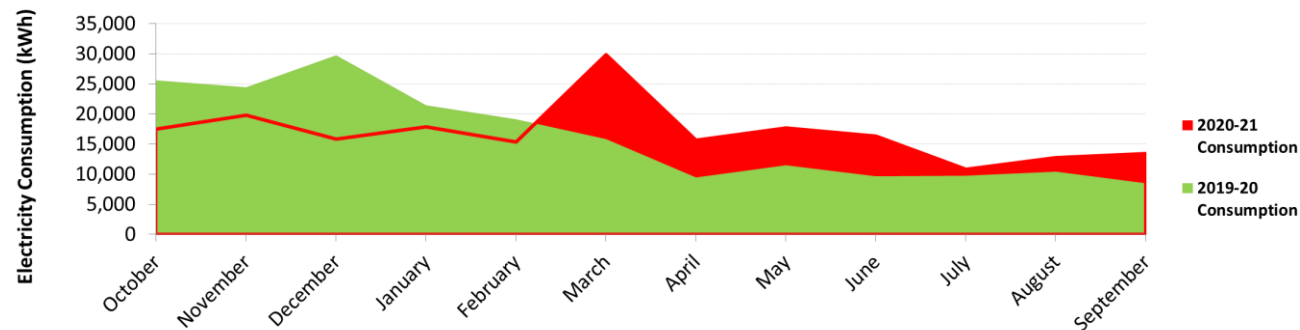
Kings Cross

Kings Cross is the highest electricity consuming site - a decrease of 4% is more than the entire electricity consumption at Archway.

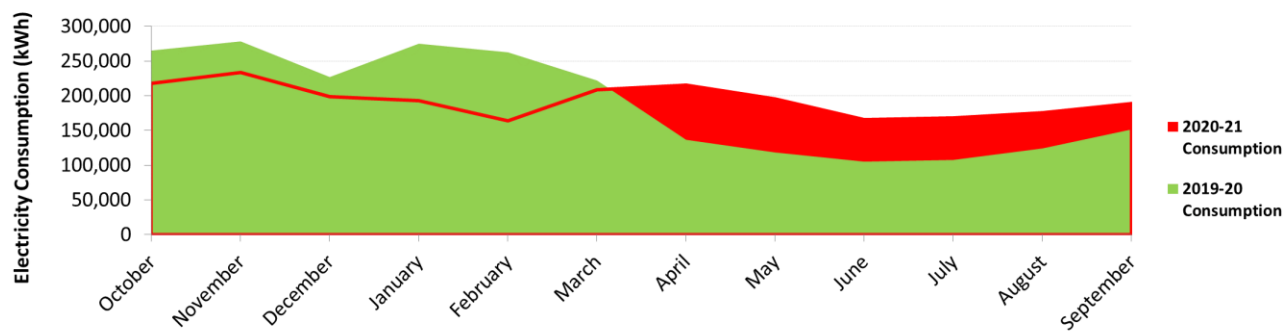

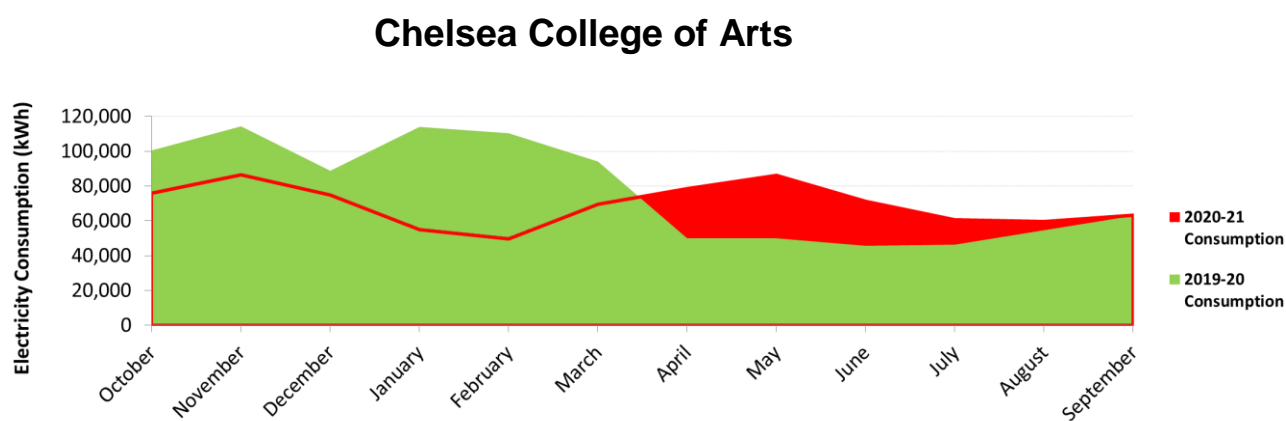

UAL manages the utilities for only the three halls below.

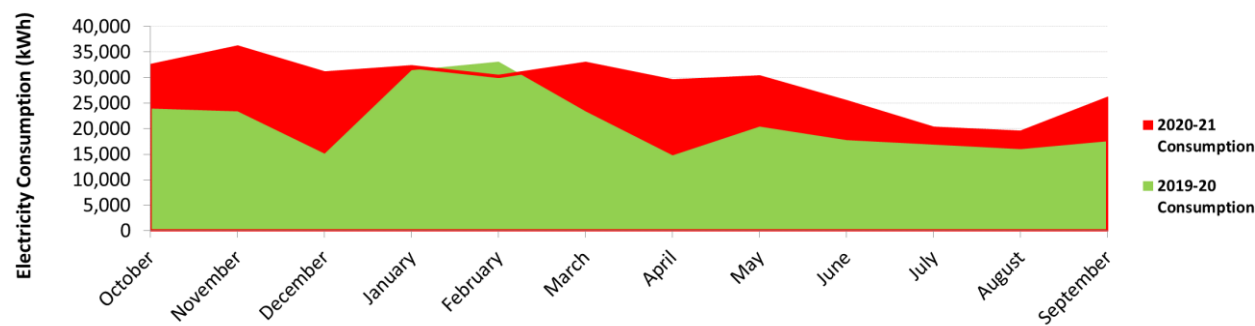

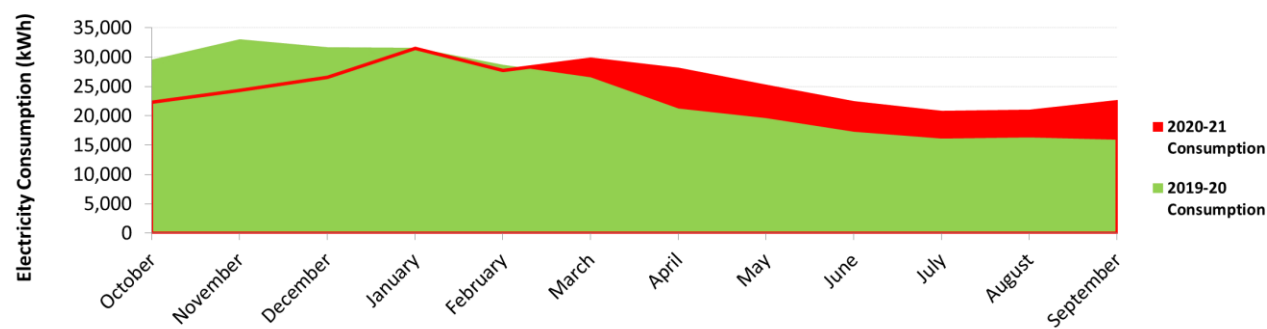
